Radio script 1

Let's get our kids back to being kids.

As of November 19, kids aged 5 to 11 can be vaccinated against COVID-19.

The vaccine helps prevent or reduce the spread of COVID-19. Like adults, children can also transmit the coronavirus to others if they're infected, even when they have no symptoms.

It's normal to have questions and concerns. Speak to your health care provider today about the benefits of vaccinating your kids against COVID-19.

The pandemic has taken a toll on our kids' mental health and well-being.

By getting your kids vaccinated, they can get back to enjoying what they love most, while protecting Elders, family, friends and the entire community.

This script is a short version of script 1.
